Restoration history	Not needed so far as the glider has been very carefully kept and maintained	
Other	Owned for many years by Don Knight and kept at RAF Halton. Purchased by Richard Moyse (Lasham) in May 2017. Attended and flew at the British national VGC rally held at Aston Down in 2017, also the 2018 international VGC rally at Stendal, Germany
