The fuselage is not the original one. 1990 acquired by Mike Birch and Graham Saw who found it abandoned in a farmer's barn. Its complete restoration at Booker by Mike and Graham marks the founding of the much heralded Booker vintage flying group. July 2006 donated to Bob van Aalst and moved to Holland.
Notable flights	None recorded though the glider has been at a number of international VGC rallies. At end 2013 2127 hours from 3874 flights
Restoration history	Completely restored at Booker 1990 - 1992 when it acquired its pink paint scheme and hence the nickname "Pink Panther"
Other	Still has its original logbook, very rare for a glider of this age. Even more amazing given its abandoned state. Donated by Bob van Aalst and his wife Sylvia to the GHC and delivered by them to Lasham on 19/6/2019
